Five panelists weighed in on the subject. Anti food waste activist Jordan Figuereido, led the discussion, describing some of the successes of the **UglyFruitAndVeg Campaign**, which has convinced Whole Foods and Walmart to begin selling "ugly" produce at a discounted rate, rather than send them to the landfill. Nick Lapis, a lobbyist for **Californians Against Waste** spoke of landmark pieces of legislation that are now being put in place to prevent confusion about food safety labeling and sell-by dates.

Kathy Carver spoke about ExtraFood.org, a non-profit harnessing volunteers who move excess food from grocers, markets and restaurants to other human service non-profits where it is badly needed. Our local activist, Jacquie Phelan, described her life in Marin County as a gleaner and harvester of dumpster-bound food. Julie Hanft co-founded the Marin Open Garden Project (her MC project), which allows gardeners to share produce with each other in local neighborhoods.

Outside in the lobby, Mar, of **Imperfect Produce** displayed what a box of "Imperfect" produce actually looks like, and how one can receive a box of rescued produce at your doorstep each week. The box I received this week could hardly have been called "Imperfect". I am thrilled to be a new customer.
