In order to make the exercise as realistic as possible, the Forum was graciously allowed the use of the San Rafael City Council Chambers. Each speech was video taped, thanks to professional videographer David Fix, and played back with positive feedback from the audience. The Forum was especially privileged to have had Mill Valley City Councilmember Stephanie Moulton-Peters in attendance, who provided invaluable comments and insights from the perspective of one who listens to real-life advocacy, good and bad, as part of her job.

The speeches covered a variety of topics, from protecting watersheds, promoting electric transportation, creating a climate change museum, improving air quality, limiting motor boat usage at a cherished lake, taking up biking and more exercise to reduce time behind the wheel, proposing an ordinance to limit idling cars, reducing plastics in the ocean, reducing light pollution, adding climate change to our public educational curriculum, enacting a carbon tax and obtaining additional funding for gray water systems.

The day concluded with an excellent presentation by the Forum's Social Media Coordinator, Tamela Fish, who described insightful ways to enhance advocacy through the use of social media.

For 44 years the Environmental Forum of Marin has successfully trained citizen advocates for the natural world. We are excited to see the students of Master Class 44 in action in the future, and are already looking forward to Master Class 45!
